December 19, 1909 reparations are being made for the Xmas entertainment at the Christian Church Christmas Night.

December 8, 1911 During the Thanksgiving Services the Payneville Christian Church caught fire from a defective flue and was considerably damaged.

December 7, 1916 There will be a parcel post sale at the Payneville Christian church on Friday night, December 8th.
